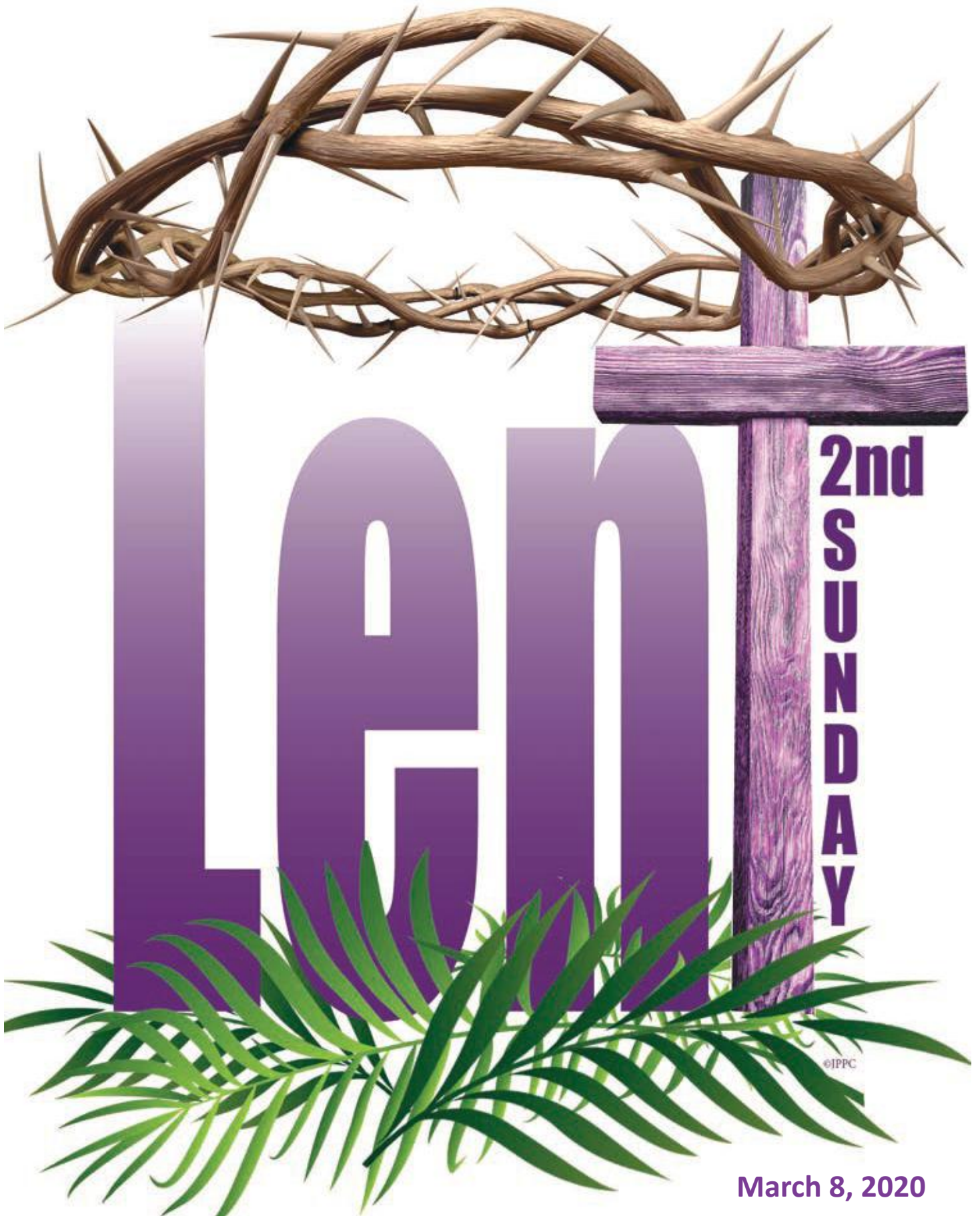

A Message from Fr. Marc

Dear Parishioners:

I pray that this has been a prayerful and holy Lenten Season for all! Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the three common themes of the season. Prayer to grow in holiness in preparation for the celebration of the Paschal Mysteries; fasting, to keep our appetites in check and to be stronger in resisting temptation; and, almsgiving, in order to be mindful of the needy among us and in order to imitate the loving charity and mercy of God. Practicing these three disciplines are a challenging, yet fulfilling way to live out this Season.

This weekend, we have our commitment Sunday for the Annual Appeal for the Archdiocese of Newark. A few weeks ago, we showed the video at Mass that highlighted the many and various ways that the Archdiocese of Newark serves the needy among us. Vocations, the Mercy House in Newark, and Campus Ministries are just a couple ways that our donations help the Church and the Kingdom of God grow. Please prayerfully consider what you can give this year and drop your gift in the basket. Perhaps your gift can be part of your Lenten almsgiving.

Lastly, the issue we have been hearing so much about over the past couple of months is the coronavirus. On Monday, the Archdiocese of Newark gave the churches of the Archdiocese guidelines as a precaution and prevention for spreading the virus in our midst. Cardinal Joseph Tobin, our Archbishop, has asked parishes to make some temporary changes in our Masses: Offering the Precious Blood will be suspended; the sign of peace should be exchanged without making physical contact (a wave or nod should be substituted); the Host can be received on the hands, as opposed to on the tongue. Also, those who distribute Communion will be sanitizing their hands before and after distribution. Finally, anyone who does not feel well or has flu-like symptoms should not attend Mass while they are ill. These simple changes will, hopefully, prevent the transmission of any virus that might be in our midst.

I look forward to celebrating the Lenten Season together with all of you, as we make this pilgrimage toward Holy Week.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK

2020 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially”, or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, March 1, 2020** to **The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 7, 2020.**

*Canon 920, §1. *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

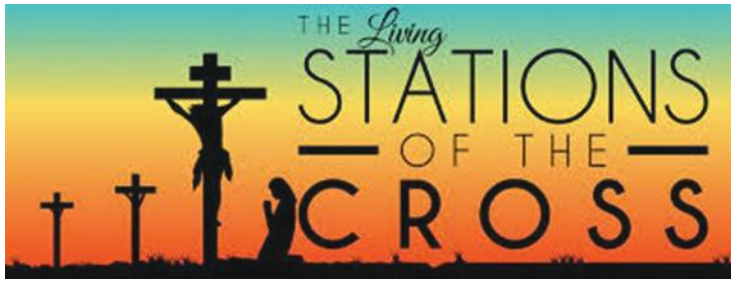

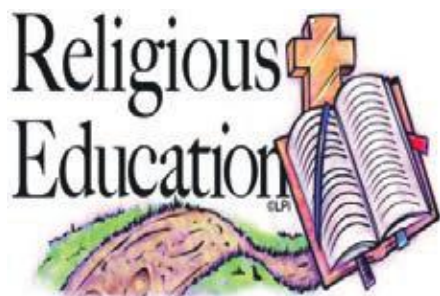

The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us – all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

This message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.

Catholic School Parents

Some of you might not be aware that Catholic Education in our Archdiocesan Schools is subsidized by the Archdiocese of Newark. Parishioners belonging to parishes within the Archdiocese pay less in tuition because they are parishioners. The discount is usually about \$900-\$1,000 per student.

This subsidy, however, comes from the parishes of the Archdiocese through an assessment of the parishes' revenue. At St. Cassian Parish, our assessment is 18% and part of that goes to school subsidies across the Archdiocese.

The Archdiocese asks that those who receive the Parishioner Discount be active, participating and contributing members of their parish. Each year, parents of school children are required to have a Parishioner Verification Form (PVF) signed by parents and their pastor attesting to the fact that they are active, participating and contributing parishioners in order to receive the parishioner discount. Equally important is your weekly presence at Mass.

I believe that it is completely reasonable to ask parishioners who receive a tuition discount to at least annually contribute the amount of tuition that they are discounted per child. In all fairness, we should not expect others to pay the discount through the assessments. At the same time, I cannot sign the PVF allowing families to receive a discount if they are not offsetting the discount itself. Please consider this when making your parish contributions.

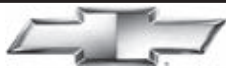
