

Catechist Role Description

Catechists are called as disciples to facilitate an Encounter with Christ – they help people grow in relationship with Christ and his church.

Qualities

- A desire to grow in and share the Catholic faith
- An awareness of God's grace and the desire to respond to that grace
- A commitment to the Church's liturgical and sacramental life and moral teachings
- A strength of character built on patience, responsibility, confidence, and creativity
- A generosity of spirit, respect for diversity, and a habit of hospitality and inclusion

Knowledge and Skills

- Basic understanding of Catholic teaching, Scripture, and Catholic Tradition
- Honest and caring relationships with the age group being served
- Effective group facilitation techniques and strategies

Requirements

- Complete initial application (form, interview, background check)
- Complete Virtus training and any supplemental training as requested
- Maintain safety and privacy of students
- Communicate with caregivers of students

Time Commitment

- Attend kickoff meeting in September
- Facilitate 25 one-hour sessions from late September to early May (holidays excluded).
- Attend 2 – 4 catechist meetings per year.
- Approximately 1 hour weekly at-home preparation/follow-up
- Commit to ongoing formation

Expectations

- Attend Mass regularly
- Foster an environment of prayer in the classroom
- Prepare lessons in advance
- Work as a team with co-catechists, substitutes, staff, and other volunteers
- Arrive at least 15 minutes early to set up the classroom
- Incorporate a variety of techniques (visual, verbal, musical, physical) to accommodate diverse learning styles
- Restore classroom at the end of each class
