Children's Liturgy of the Word is a program in which the Sunday readings are proclaimed and explained on a level appropriate to children in grades pre-K through 5 at the 9:30 a.m. Mass. Any child in this age group may participate—no registration is necessary. The children gather with their leader in front of the altar after the Opening Prayer. They are then sent forth by the presider in procession to Larkin Hall to hear the Sunday readings and reflect on them in age-appropriate terms. The children end their Liturgy session with a prayer and return to their families at the time of the Presentation of the Gifts.

This important ministry was curtailed during the COVID-19 pandemic. We would like to once again offer children the opportunity to hear the same Sunday readings as adults hear but in simpler language that is easier for them to grasp. # THE CROSS

Several hundred versions of the cross have existed throughout the centuries; it is one of the most universal symbols of all time.

Only about fifty different forms of the cross have been used extensively by Christians. Among these are the Greek cross, with arms of equal length; the Latin cross, which is the form on which Christ was crucified and is the most widely used; and the crucifix, which supports a figure of either the crucified or risen Christ.



Early Christians believed that the cross was a sign of sorrow and suffering and hesitated to use it as a symbol of their faith.

But through his death on the cross, Jesus rose triumphant, forever the victor over sin and death.

The cross stands for his everlasting love for us. And while it does remind us of His sacrifice, it is through His death that we can live with Him forever.

In this sense the cross is a glorious symbol of redemption, new life, and hope.

## The Blessing of the Herb Basil

With the arrival of the great September feast of the Exaltation of the Life-Giving Cross (September 14th), the old-world custom of blessing and distributing the herb basil is brought to our attention.

The devout Byzantine Empress Helen, the mother of Constantine the Great (Edict of Milan, 312 A.D.), traveled to Jerusalem in the hope of finding the wood of the true cross on which Jesus had died. Equipped with a retinue of soldiers, servants, workers, and supplies, she left Byzantium and embarked on the dangerous and long journey. Sustained by prayer, reflection, fasting, and her strong faith, she oversaw numerous unsuccessful excavations on the hill known as Calvary. With time passing and supplies and patience dwindling, she was very much aware of the fatigue and weariness of the members of her royal expedition. Fearing mutiny and rebellion, she fell to her knees and began to lament with prayers and tears the futility of their endeavors. Without notice, the wind picked up, and she was overwhelmed by a distinct smell wafting in the air. Helen literally “followed her nose” and came upon the source of this aromatic scent, an unknown lush and leafy green plant. Instinctively, she ordered her troops to carefully search the earth around the fragrant plant. There, after much sweat and toil were found fragments and pieces of the true cross. The wood of Jesus’s cross was authenticated by the numerous cures and miracles experienced by those who in faith touched the sacred wood.

After savoring the leaves of the green plant she christened *it vasileos*—*basil*, the herb of the great king.

Celebrating the exaltation of the true cross, the zeal of the Empress St. Helen, and the discovery of the wonderful herb known as basil, together we joyfully acclaim:

***AVE CRUX, SPES UNICA!***

***HAIL, O CROSS, OUR ONLY HOPE!***

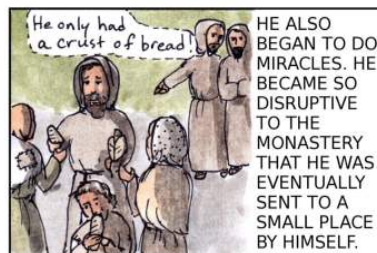

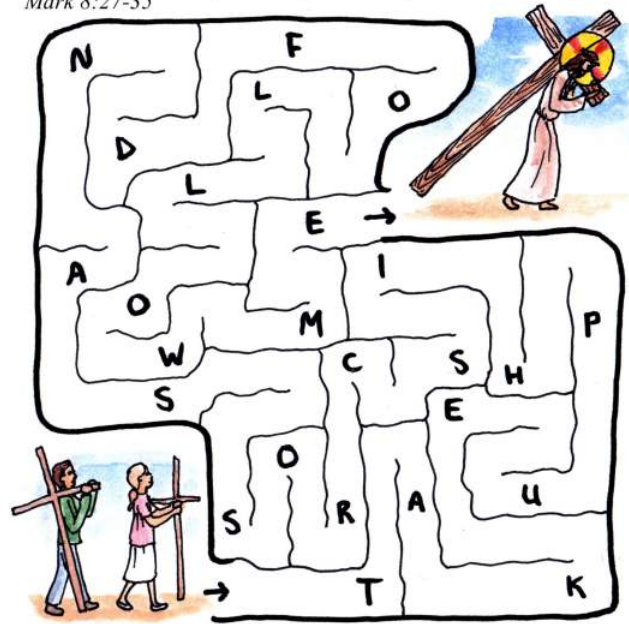
