The Transitus of St Francis of Assisi October 3, 7 p.m.



One of the most beloved and popular saints in the history of the Church is known as the “Little Poor Man,” *Il Poverello*.

Eight hundred years have passed, and the dynamic image of Saint Francis of Assisi still fascinates both young and old.

In contemporary religious thought, San Francisco is most often identified with animals, ecology, environment, gardens, and household pets. The tale of the taming of the ferocious wolf of Gubbio, Franco Zeffirelli’s beautiful film “Brother Sun & Sister Moon,” and the thought-provoking historical novel by Nikos Kazantzakis *Saint Francis* help flesh out this exceptional follower of Jesus Christ.

For the first time, perhaps, in the history of St. Cassian Parish, we invite everyone to the very moving and poignant Franciscan Devotion known as the *Transitus*.


The Transitus of Saint Francis will be celebrated on Thursday, October 3, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. here in our parish church.

Through narrations, reflections, songs, readings, signs, and symbols this distinct “para-liturgical” will provide us with a different perspective to the Mystic, the Stigmatist, the Poet, and the Deacon known as the “Seraphic Father.” The devotion is a graced time of pondering our earthly journey, the reality of death, and the joyous hope of eternal happiness

Holy Guardian Angels, Oct. 2nd



God gave us guardian angels to protect and guide us. Saint Jerome wrote that the human soul is so valuable in heaven that every human person has a guardian angel from the moment the person comes into being. These pure spirits, which we can neither see nor feel, play an

important role in our lives. Jesus refers to them when he says, “Take care that you do not despise one of these little ones; for, I tell you, in heaven their angels continually see the face of my Father in heaven” (Matthew 18:10).

Angels are messengers from God. The word angel comes from the Greek word for “messenger.” In a very real way, these powerful spirits point out to us the ways of God. Guardian angels assist us in work or study. In times of temptation, these spiritual beings direct us to do good. Thomas Aquinas said that angels are the most excellent of creatures because they have the greatest intelligence next to God.

Perhaps the guardian angels are best known for protecting us from physical danger, but their main role is to care for the salvation of our souls. It is wonderful to know that God has promised to love, protect, and be with us always. One way he does this is through the care of the angels. Whenever you meet with danger or discouragement, your guardian angel is your personal, heavenly bodyguard. The angels also offer prayers to God for us. Because angels always see and hear God, they can intercede for us. We should love our guardian angels, respect them, and pray to them.

In early Christianity there was no feast for the guardian angels, just one for the archangels. But in the 15th and 16th centuries, the feast of the Guardian Angels was unofficially celebrated in Austria, Spain, and Portugal. In 1608 Pope Paul V made it a universal feast. In doing so, he helped to make us aware of the guardian angels, not just one day in October, but every day of our lives. (See *prayer* on page 3.)

The Feast of the Archangels

Today, September 29, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Archangels—Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. The word “angel” means “messenger.” Angels are messengers sent by God to help us on the path to salvation. The *archangels* are entrusted with particularly important missions.

Each of the three archangels appears in the Bible. Raphael appears in the *Book of Tobit* (ch. 12), where he’s sent by God to help Sarah and Tobias live a happy marriage. Raphael accompanies, guides, and advises the couple and enables Tobias to cure his father’s blindness.

the *Gospel of Luke* recounts the Annunciation: “The Angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph of the house of David. The virgin’s name was Mary” (1:26-27). It is Gabriel’s greeting to Mary that we repeat each time we pray the “Hail Mary”: “Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you” (1:28).

Michael also appears in the *Book of Revelation*. When Lucifer, the angel of light, rebels against God, Michael defeats him and expels him from Paradise (12:7-9). Michael is shown as the leader of the army of God and the terror of demons. For centuries, his intercession has been invoked to fight the spirit of evil and repel Satan.

The three archangels have a role to play in our lives. Gabriel shows us that God is our strength and reminds us not to be afraid and to fulfill God’s purpose for us as Mary did. Raphael is a faithful guide on the path of healing that God wants to accomplish for each of us to restore us in body, soul, and spirit. Michael is a powerful protector against the forces of evil, especially the spiritual evil that can hinder and weigh us down. We can seek help from these three great heavenly messengers and servants of God. Let us ask for strength, healing, and protection from the Lord through the intercession of Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. *Let us not hesitate to implore their help, especially in times of trial and struggle.*

Guardian Angels



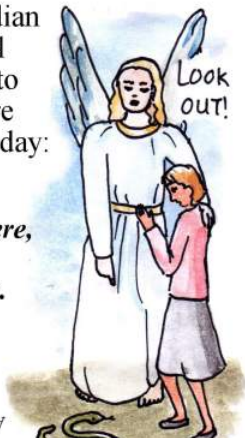

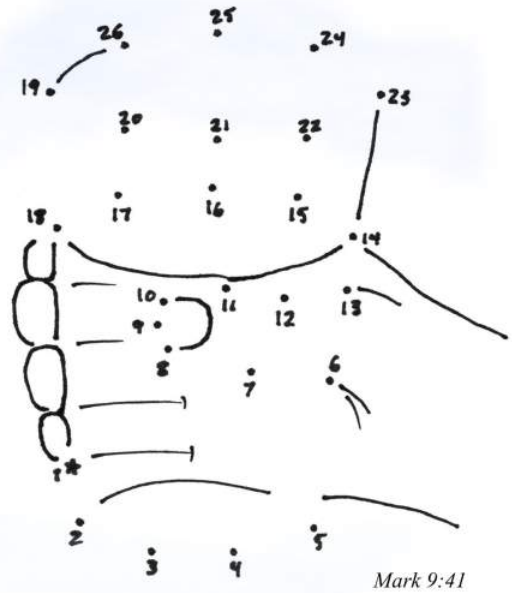
