Dearest Parishioners & Friends of Saint Cassian,

On Friday, October 11th, we gathered in church with heavy hearts to celebrate the life of one of our most dedicated parishioners, Regina Ann Sammon. Regina passed away on Sunday, October 6th, surrounded by her loving family.

We are most grateful to Father Camilo Cruz for offering such a beautiful Mass and his kind words and to Monsignor Kulik, Monsignor Doran, and Father Gene Gniewyk for being here as well. So many people came to church; so many of our parishioners, school staff, and students were in attendance. They were all a great comfort to Regina's family.

She lived an incredible life of service to others, and I would like to offer you, our parishioners, a reflection on how Regina's life and her dedication greatly impacted the lives of many people here at Saint Cassian.

In times when we struggle, it's ok to grieve and have faith at the same time. Our hearts were broken, but we comforted each other with hope for Regina. The prophet Isaiah spoke words of comfort and revealed the ancient promise: "He will gather the lambs in his arms and carry them in his bosom."

Regina has been gathered in God's arms. And she could not be in a safer place.

We are people of faith. We put our faith and trust in the words of Christ, even when we don't understand certain things. One thing we do understand is that Regina was a woman of great faith.

Regina would have learned a lot from her parents, Eugene & Helen Welsh. She—along with her siblings, Mary, Eugene, and Vincent—would have learned what real love, hard work, and sacrifice were all about. The kind of person Regina grew up to be had everything to do with what she learned from her parents.

Over time, she grew up and became her own person. God blessed her with beautiful children who came into her life. She knew her children were a gift from God.

Two thousand years ago, there was a beautiful and noble woman who lived in ancient Rome—Cornelia Africana. She was the mother of Tiberius, who became the Emperor of Rome. One day at her home, she was visited by a woman who came to show off her expensive and elegant jewelry. According

to legend, when the visitor asked to see *her* jewels, Cornelia pointed to her sons and very proudly said: “These are my jewels.”

When Cornelia referred to her children as her “jewels,” she was saying that they were the most special and precious thing that she had. Regina knew that her children, her grandchildren, and her entire family were her “jewels.” They were the most precious thing that she had. Her family was her greatest treasure in life, and her greatest achievement. I think it is what she was most proud of.

A person’s obituary can tell you a little about a person, but pictures always say so much more. They speak of the kind of life a person lived. They capture the happiness and the many good times that a person enjoyed.

I saw many pictures of Regina, smiling and happy. Many pictures show Regina holding and embracing the people she loved, and other pictures show her being held and embraced by people who loved her. Regina lived for her children and loved them, but what is most important and fulfilling for a mother is that her children deeply loved her in return. Regina did many things, but her true life’s work was being dedicated to her beautiful family and watching them grow and reach their true potential. She loved life, and she taught her children to enjoy life and to be grateful.

Jesus said to his Apostles just before he left them: “You will be my witness.” The task of witnessing to Christ has been handed down over 2,000 years. Regina, by accepting Christ as her savior, gladly accepted the challenge of being His witness and going and making more disciples.

A witness needs not only generosity but also courage. Regina was both generous and courageous. Christianity depends on witnesses, disciples like Regina, who are genuine and authentic Christians not just in their words but also in their deeds.

Jesus said to those who bear witness to him: “You will have honor in heaven.”

He says: “Everyone who acknowledges me before others, I also will acknowledge before my Father in Heaven.” That means that Jesus has presented Regina to His Father and has said to God: “This is my faithful witness, my friend, who helped make thousands of new disciples.”

I am sure she heard the words: Come into my kingdom, good and faithful servant.

While growing up, she may have realized early in life that she had been chosen for a special purpose. She had qualities and a character that made her right to be a teacher. As a teacher, she helped add much quality and value to the education of the many students she got to teach.

It is rare and a blessing to find people who add value to your life. But this is exactly what Regina did for many. Regina was able to touch the lives and hearts of thousands of young people by the way she lived her commitment to serve God's people, with her quiet wisdom, a generous smile, and her dedication to St. Cassian School and Church.

She had a deep faith that she joyfully shared with everyone. In a world where some people are always looking to take, Regina joyfully and generously gave of herself. There was really nothing that she would not do for someone. I don't think she knew the word "no." She was always ready to go the extra mile for you, and, if you needed her, she would walk with you.

Belonging to a parish means that you belong to a parish family, a spiritual family where we all come together to pray in our spiritual home. Our beautiful church was filled at her funeral Mass with people who wanted to be there because they loved Regina and because she made a difference in our lives. She was a very special and treasured member of our parish family who will be missed.

Regina lived a quiet life of service and faith. Faith that was first taught to her by her parents. And then a faith that she nurtured herself and developed. As the years went by, her faith grew, and her faith was tested. She endured quite a lot, and many times was given a choice. Do I keep putting my faith in God, or do I do this life on my own? She chose to walk with Christ.

Jesus says: "I have something even greater for you, you are no longer slaves; you are friends."

Regina knew that, no matter what would happen, she had Christ, not only as her savior but as her friend. In the midst of living life, teaching, raising a family, going to work, and relationships with other people, she tried to live in the spirit of the Beatitudes, humbly living the virtues of generosity and kindness.

Jesus said, "Come to me all you who labor and find life burdensome. and I will give you rest." The hand of the carpenter from Nazareth reached out, took Regina's hand, and brought her home. Regina is safe. She has God's peace.

The tender hands that raised a family and worked so hard over the years are now at rest. Christ

did for her what we could not do. He freed her soul—her spirit from her body—from her tomb and restored her and made her whole again.

She knew that she was blessed to have many people who cared about her and did not forget her. You all helped Regina carry her cross and lighten her burden.

Our school & our parish for many years were blessed by having Regina in our lives. God put Regina into the lives of so many people and it was not by accident. Without a doubt, Regina was a part of God's plan for many years for the students at Saint Cassian School and the young people of our parish so that we would know about Jesus and grow in our faith. By living her life as a true disciple of Christ, she sweetly taught thousands of young people the value and meaning of life as a follower of Jesus.

The real joy of her life was what she gave to others. She never missed an opportunity to be a blessing. We spend our entire lives learning about a man that one day we will meet. Jesus himself. She spent much of her life teaching about Christ so that others would know him as their Savior and their friend.

Regina now knows Jesus personally.

So, her earthly journey came to an end. One last time, she came to our beautiful church, her spiritual home for many years. We prayed for her, and we showed our gratitude to God—for the beautiful children she brought into the world and for the love and kindness she gave to many.

So be happy for her; she is at peace. Think of her as reunited with her parents, with those she loved, and with those who loved her. She did the best she could with what God gave her to do in this life.

The name Regina means Queen. Queens wear crowns, and without a doubt our Regina has received her crown. Each of her children is a small and precious gem in the crown Regina received when she arrived in Heaven. So, remember Regina for who she truly was: a woman who was faithful to God, devoted to her church, proud to call Jesus her friend, and who loved her beautiful family.

Regina's life of service was an inspiration to all of us. Perhaps she can inspire more people to give of themselves to God and to others. May she rest in peace and intercede for us.

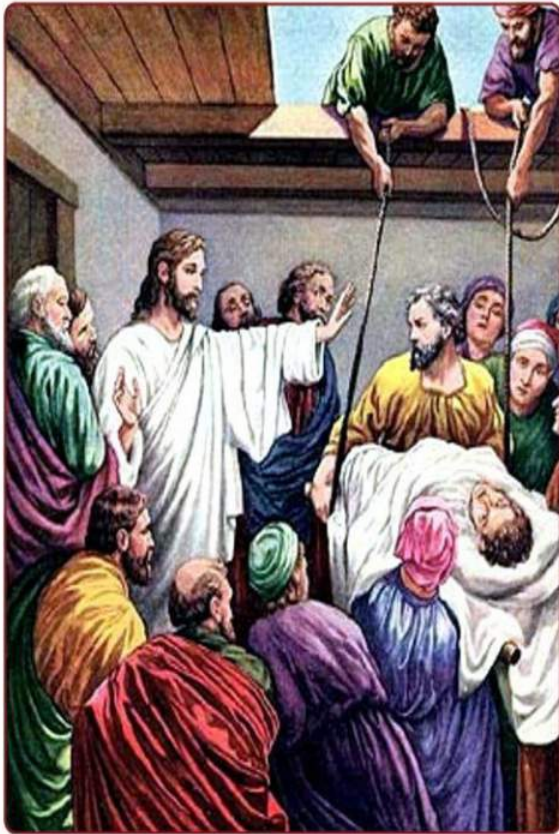

The thrust of all of these evenings will be FORGIVENESS and HEALING. There will be PRIESTS



available for CONFESSION also. Healing starts in the Confessional with the Sacrament of Reconciliation; you might want to consider this option during this time.

Healing is NOT just for the Physically Impaired. Mental and Emotional stresses and strains can take a heavier toll on our lives, even more than the worst of diseases. So if you or your family are in need of HEALING in these areas, come and experience the Lord, and what He can do for you.

Come and enjoy Jesus by Worshiping Him. Come and see what Our Lord has for you. Come and be healed.

Paul Rymniak sees it as an honor to be at our parish to conduct his HEALING MISSION, which also includes the ROSARY and the STATIONS OF THE CROSS. Paul will offer his healing efforts to all who seek it. All Christians are welcome to attend, whether they are Catholic or not.

According to Paul, who credits GOD and NOT HIMSELF for his successes, he possesses several hundred testimonies from doctors and lay people that confirm

healings GOD has used him to perform.

He makes NO claim that all who come to him are cured and he theorizes that ANGER within the ill person may prevent healing. GOD'S healing touch is available to everyone. Sometimes it takes the form of physical cures, and sometimes it takes the form of suffering and even DEATH. Whatever GOD chooses it is for the greater good of all.

Great People Serve Others!

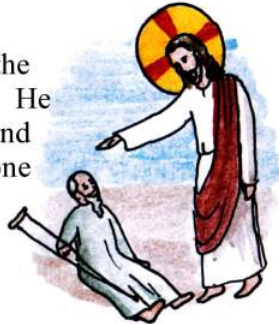
In today's Gospel reading, Jesus tells us that the people who are really great are those who serve. Here are some really great people:

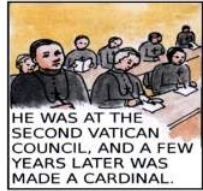
