We are grateful to God and our students, families, and catechists that the 2024—2025 catechetical year is off to a great start! God called each of the thirty people in our Catechetical Ministry by name, and they said, “Yes!” As a result, we have a diverse ministry that includes high school and college students, single adults, parents, and senior members of our parish. They have accepted the call to support 265 children enrolled in the Faith Formation program this year. St. Cassian parish is alive and growing!

New this year, we hosted a welcome back session for families during the first week of classes. Balloons, music, and refreshments contributed to the festivities. Families met their child’s catechist upon arrival and enjoyed socializing with fellow parishioners. We opened in prayer together, giving praise to God for the gift of our children and asking God to bless them with ears that hear God’s voice, eyes that see God’s presence in all things, lips that proclaim God’s word, hearts that are God’s dwelling place, hands that do works of charity, and feet that walk in the way of Jesus Christ (adapted from Loyola Press “Prayer for Parents”).

Parents were invited to remain in the gym with me and Fr. Steve while the children joined their catechists in their classrooms. Fr. Steve and I shared a little bit about ourselves and our hopes and vision for the year ahead. Parents asked questions and enjoyed some time together as fellow Catholics who are committed to centering Christ in the lives of their families.

We are excited to work with Loyola Press and its “Finding God” curriculum. Using a heart-to-head approach, each session includes a four-step lesson plan to (1) engage children with Scripture, (2) explore and deepen a child’s faith and apply it to their lives as they read, discuss, and experience session content,

(3) reflect through core Catholic prayers and prays of thanks, petition, intercession, and praise, and (4) respond through a review of key concepts and vocabulary. Each session also includes a page for the students to discuss with their families.

Another element of this curriculum is that each unit includes a patron saint, with related resources to allow them to “go deeper” in their learning and understanding of Catholic saints. As humans, we are all “saints in the making,” so it is helpful to have role models and to view each day as a chance to be our better selves through our thoughts, words, and actions. The children were each given a battery-operated tea-light candle and encouraged to create a sacred space at home where they can be with God. Families are encouraged to use a companion Loyola Press prayer book to equip them with direction, suggestions, and resources to enhance their faith journey and lifelong practice of prayer. As parents and grandparents, aunts and uncles, we can help our children come to know and love God by modeling a life lived in prayer. Together, we can cultivate a daily practice of praying for our children, with our children, and over our children.

We appreciate your prayers and support of our Faith Formation program throughout the year. Please hold our candidates for Reconciliation, Communion, and Confirmation especially close in your hearts and prayers, as their sacramental journeys are now underway. We look forward to our Reconciliation and Communion candidates partnering with Confirmation candidates for team-based sacramental activities throughout the year to enrich their faith journeys.

May God continue to bless you and your families.

- 3. Return the requested items and bag to Larkin Hall no later than Sunday, November 10.**

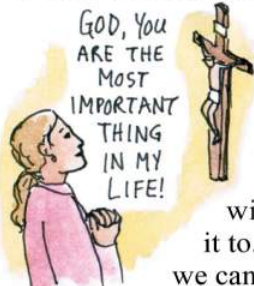
