ALL SAINTS DAY



In honor of All Saints Day on November 1, our parish hosted our first Saint Fair for the students enrolled in our Faith Formation program on Sunday, October 27, Monday, October 28, and Tuesday, October 29. In an effort to introduce the youth of the parish to our Catholic saints, St. Cassian Confirmation candidates worked in small groups to research the lives of many saints and to create faith-based trivia questions and carnival-style games for students in grades 1—7 to play in the school gym during their Faith Formation session. Thanks to tremendous teamwork, the fair included more than 20 game stations staffed by Confirmation candidates and adult volunteers who taught the children how to play each game and gave participants candy and other prizes.

This event would not have been possible without the support of our adult and youth parish volunteers who helped conceptualize this event, created a variety of the games and activities, and oversaw set up, implementation, and clean up. What a blessing and joy to grow in our faith together through fun and friendship! Games included:

St. Luke, Patron Saint of Physicians & Surgeons—players used tongs to transfer mini “bones”

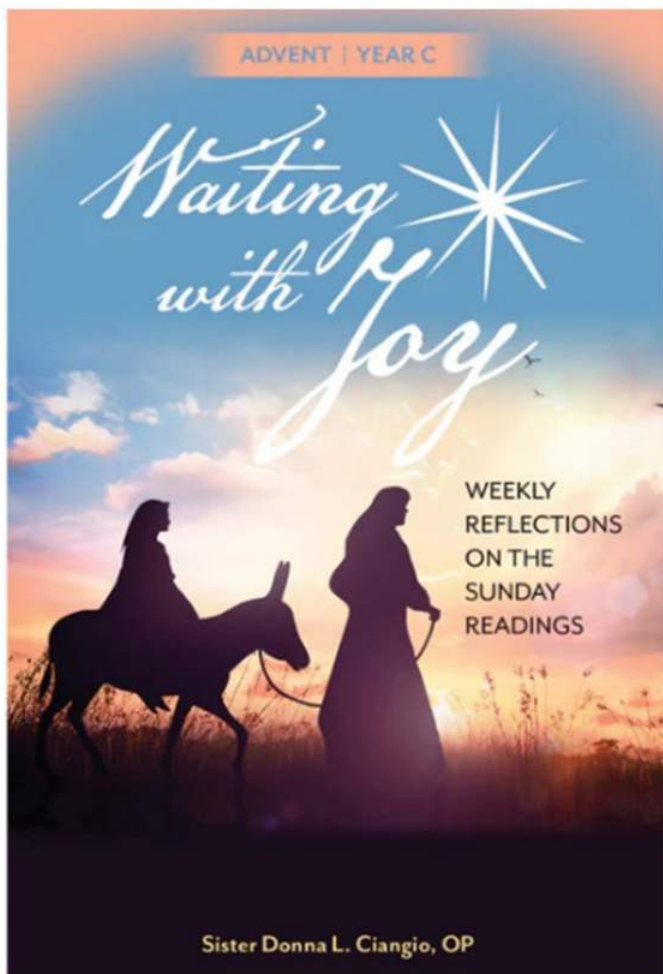
St. Peter, “Keys to Heaven”—players guessed which cup a toy key was hidden under

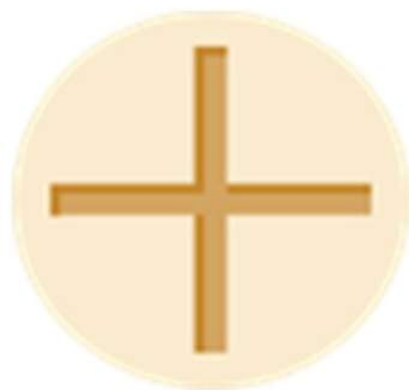

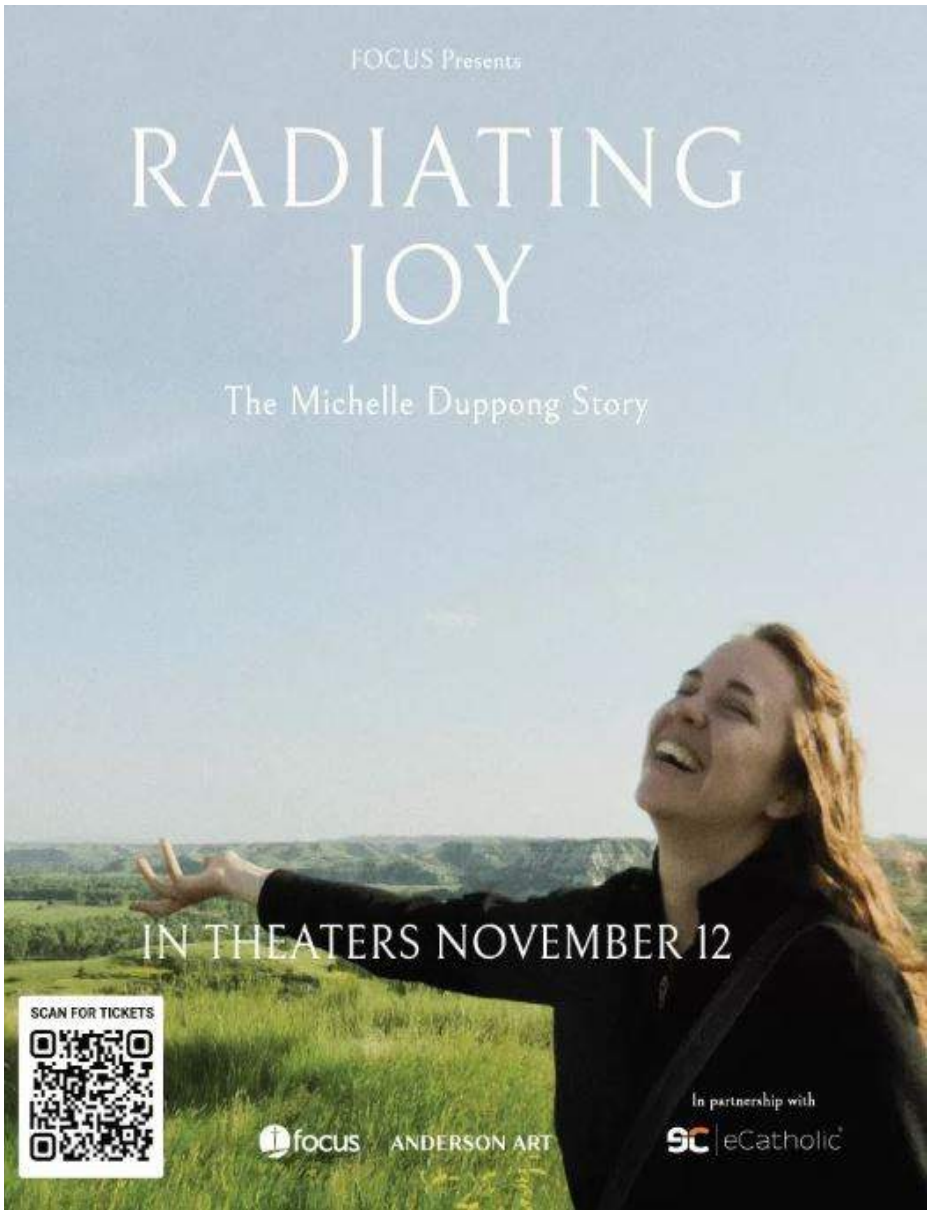

This is the story of Servant of God Michelle Duppong, who bore witness to Christ through heroic suffering and a passion for inviting others to be transformed by His love. The film, directed by Danny Anderson, tells the story of Michelle’s beautiful and faith-filled life, especially during her diagnosis, treatment, and death.

In June 2022, Bishop David Kagan of Bismarck, North Dakota, announced the opening of the diocesan phase of investigation into Michelle’s life, which could lead to beatification and canonization. On December 25, 2015, Duppong died of cancer at the age of 31.

The Michelle Duppong Guild and FOCUS, where Michelle served for six years, are honored to make known to the world the importance of Michelle’s inspiring and heartening story.

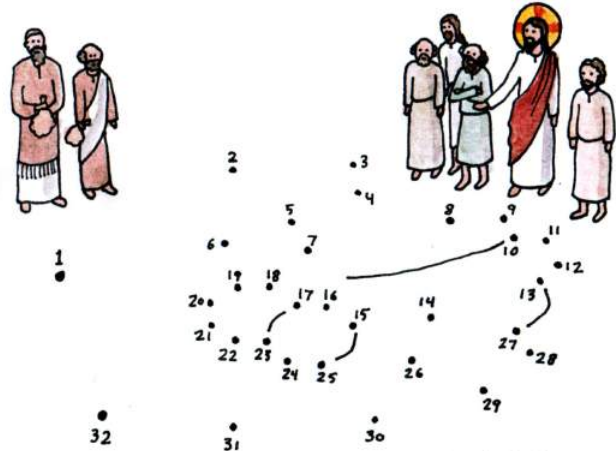

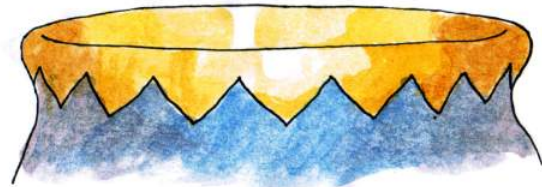

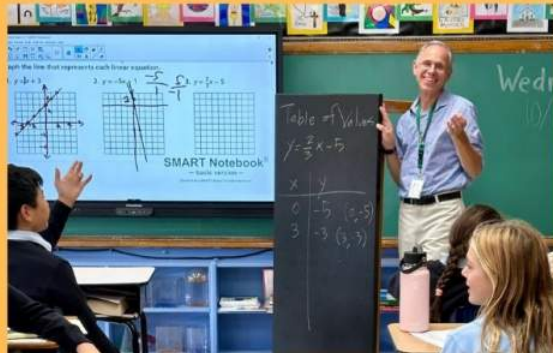
