The *Baptism* of the *Lord*

Sunday, January 12th, is the last day of liturgical Christmas in the Western (Latin/Roman) rite of the Catholic Church. It is the ***Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord*** in the Jordan River.



In conjunction with this ancient feast, fresh holy water was blessed at the 5:30 p.m. Vigil Mass on Saturday, January 11th.

It is important that, at the beginning of this new year 2025, every home in our parish have this sacramental water, known also as “Jordan Water.”

We encourage everyone to bring small empty containers to church next weekend to benefit from this newly blessed water. (Small, empty holy water bottles will also be available in church.)

Returning home after church with blessed Jordan Water, we recall our baptism and pray the ***Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be*** as we sprinkle all the rooms of our house or apartment, invoking God’s protection and care for the coming months of 2025.

Paul Rymniak is an ordinary man, or so he claims. Many will disagree with his self-assessment, for he is known throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico and Puerto Rico. He is not a medical doctor or ordained minister or priest. He says he sees Christ working through him and says that there is scriptural basis for his work. (Matt. 18-19)



Paul, who credits **GOD, NOT HIMSELF**, for his successes, has been in Ministry for 37 years.

Paul conducts his Healing Mission in approximately 25 churches a year and is the director of the Center for Peace. He also publishes a monthly newsletter that reaches thousands of people all over the world. He has had his own Catholic T.V. program and a series of tapes, including the one tape that started his ministry, *The Healing Rosary*. He wrote *The Mystery of Healing*, a book detailing his life in the healing ministry with his own personal story of how it all began.

Fr. Marek is a married Byzantine Catholic priest, serving as the Rector of the Cathedral of St. Michael the Archangel in Passaic, NJ. With his wife Miriam they raise three children, Caroline, Elias, and Marco. For 25 years he has been teaching iconography classes in the USA and Europe. He has painted over 800 icons which are venerated in churches and private homes around the world.



In May of 2024, Pope Francis announced a Holy Year of Jubilee, entitled Jubilee 2025—Pilgrims of Hope. The Jubilee Year opened in Rome on the eve of the Nativity of the Lord, December 24, 2024, and concludes on the Epiphany of the Lord, January 6, 2026.

What exactly is a “jubilee”?

The basic definition is “special anniversary” and “season of celebration,” but that only scratches the surface. “Jubilee” comes from the Hebrew word *jobel* to announce the beginning of a jubilee year, marking the occasion to conduct a spiritual “reset”: “For it is a jubilee, it shall be holy to you” (Lev. 25:12).

The Old Testament describes how the jubilee was a time of rest for the land and restoration for its people. The Jubilee was a year for social justice: There was a restitution of land to the original owners, a forgiveness of monetary debts, and the liberation of any slaves or indentured servants. The Hebrews were asked to “proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants (Lev. 25:20)

The Hebrews ceased their celebration of the jubilee in 600 B.C., when the Jews were held captive in Babylon, and have not resumed the practice. The Catholic Church aimed to restore the sacredness of this celebration by instituting a jubilee year approximately every 25 years. In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII instituted the first one in Church history. Since then, the Church has celebrated 26 ordinary and three extraordinary jubilees. Many will remember the last jubilee year in 2015—2016, the “extraordinary” Jubilee of Mercy.

While this year’s “ordinary” jubilee will celebrate several important historical markers, such as the 1,700th anniversary of the Ecumenical Council of Nicea, during which a unanimous vote approved the Nicene Creed, it is also the Church’s personal invitation for us to have an authentic experience of love of God through reconciliation, mercy, and forgiveness. It is an invitation for us to rekindle our hope in salvation through Jesus Christ. Additionally, the Eastern and Western Christian churches’ calendars will providentially be in sync in 2025 so that Easter will be celebrated on the same day, April 20. Pope Francis is using this as an opportunity to invite Eastern Orthodox communities to a discussion about unity, such as regarding calendars.

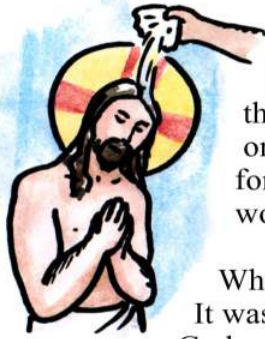
The theme of this jubilee is hope. Our faith is anchored in hope. Christ’s death and resurrection showed us God’s redemptive grace. We have hope for healing, forgiveness, and eternal life by believing in Him and spreading the Good News. Saint Paul writes, “we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God ... because God’s love has been poured into our hearts” (Rom. 5:2,5).

We should take comfort in our Christian hope.

Pope Francis knows that sometimes it’s hard to hope in the tumultuous times we live in. Evil, violence, and darkness exist tangibly in our world. In response to this reality, the Pope asks us not to be tempted into thinking that evil can overwhelm us. We can persist in hope by design and praying for peace in our world and for sharing an enthusiasm for life. He asks us especially to consider how to revive joy for living that is not tied to materialism, appearances or expectations.

When you were baptized God was getting you ready for a special job too. He was giving you grace so that you could grow closer to Him and bring other people closer to Him too.

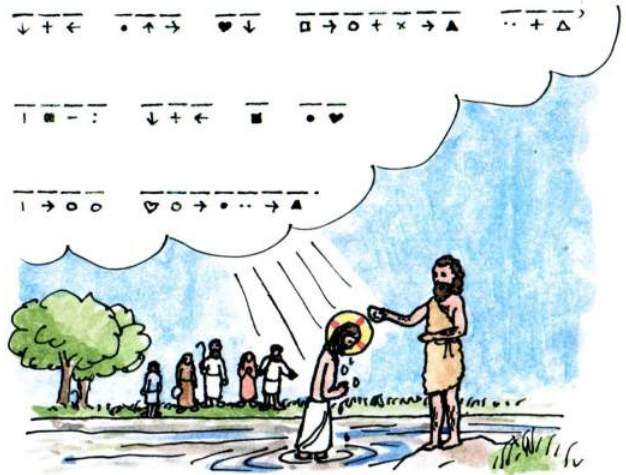

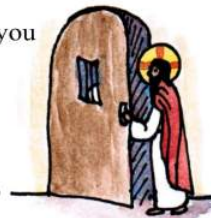
